M-DCPS will offer Foreign Language Immersion camps in Spanish and Haitian-Creole in schools across the district. These camps will focus on providing students with intensive instruction in the targeted language through a thematic, blended, and interactive approach.

Spanish

The goal of this intensive summer program is to provide an accelerated Spanish learning course which focuses on conversation/ verbal communication in Spanish through Reader’s Theater, the study of fables, or other literary practices. Oral language skills will be developed through storytelling, using puppets, felt board characters, or graphic animations. The emphasis is on promoting fluency through expression. Each student will have the opportunity to choose, rehearse, and present short play-like scripts to classmates representing the weekly readings. Role-playing will maximize students’ engagement as every student in the group has a part. Students will have the opportunity to contextualize language, practice inventiveness, foster retention, and engage in self-expression.

The camp will be implemented in the Schoolhouse Model.
